University profile	The University of Applied Sciences (EAH) Jena is a small-scale public funded university; research focused in cutting-edge technology and with a hands-on mentality throughout all of the study programmes. Currently, about 4,500 students (20 percent international) are enrolled in 26 Bachelor's and 16 Master's programmes in the fields of engineering, economics and health sciences, all accredited by the Accreditation, Certification and Quality Assurance Institute ACQUIN.
City profile	Jena is a major science hub in eastern Germany, with two Universities and 12 research institutes (e.g. Max Planck, Leibniz and Fraunhofer research societies). With a total population of 100,000 inhabitants – including 20,000 students, 4,500 scientists and 32 percent of the employees holding an academic degree – Jena is a young and vibrant city that offers excellent conditions for studying as well as enjoying a high quality of living.

Priority in room allocation	Exchange students have highest priority for the distribution of dorm rooms. It is almost guaranteed that exchange students receive a room offer. Precondition is that the student applies for a dorm room on time as advised by the International Office.

Tutors are students from higher semesters who know Jena and the university well. Semester ticket	With the payment of the semester fee, students receive a Germany-wide transportation ticket (“Deutschlandticket”) that is valid for the whole semester for all public local and regional transportation services in Germany.
